### Thought: What Can I Do For You?

**Scripture reading: Isaiah 41:10 and 13-** *Fear thou not; for I am with thee: be not dismayed; for I am thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness.*

*For I the lord thy God will hold thy right hand, saying unto thee, Fear not; I will help thee.*

So “What can I do for you? The Lord is speaking and asking the question. Can’t you stop right now, take a few moments, and tell the Lord what’s on your mind? We tend to rush through life thinking we have to solve all our problems, the broken, hurt frustrating places that come up in our lives, we have to solve them. Guess what? Who made the mountains? Who made the valleys? Who made you and me? Don’t you think the one that made us is capable of fixing the broken places in our lives? Why are we afraid to tell him what’s going on in our lives? The Bible reveals Jesus speaking in John 10: 30, “*I and my Father are one.*”

Jesus needs to be real in our lives. Scriptures tell us in John 14: 6, *Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.*

What can I do for you? Dare to tell Jesus. Dare to reveal your hearts concerns. Dare to release to Jesus, the needs in your life great or small. Corrie ten Boom recalls in her book “*Don’t wrestle just nestle*”, her need for a *hankie* (handkerchief). She had a head cold while in prison and needed one to wipe her nose. She tells how her sister prayed for a hankie and a friend just happened to be working in the prison hospital sewing, making hankies. The friend lead by the spirit of God brought a hankie to Corrie ten Boom. God hears the cries of his children and he will strengthen and deliver. So once again the question comes from our Lord, “What can I do for you?”

**Prayer:** Holy Father, open our mouth to speak to you, open our mind to receive you unafraid and with boldness that comes from knowing you are our Father. Help us stand and proclaim to you all our needs and concerns, realizing you are holding us with the right hand of your righteousness. Thank you for your holding power. Amen
